1. SETTING THE STAGE FOR "WICKED PROBLEMS"!

- Changing 21st Century performing and creative arts landscapes globally
- Higher music education and music research institutions are responding to these changes
- Wider variety of relevant, important topics and developing fields: e.g., graduate employability, dynamic curricula, stylistic diversity, cultural identities, rethinking histories, digital archiving, student wellbeing, trauma-informed approaches, contemporary commercial music, AND MANY MORE!


"Wicked problems" are multifaceted, interconnected, and complex issues, that cannot be solved with reductionistic or traditional problem-solving approaches (Lawrence, *et al.*, 2022).



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<u>Interdisciplin</u>

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Interdisciplin

Can lead to the development of new disciplines due to the very close disciplinary interactions

Achieve more comprehensive understandings by combining expertise

Although variable, still governed by disciplinary frameworks -Builds on & augments interdisciplinary collaboration

-Theoretical unity of knowledge transcends disciplinary boundaries

-Social engagement: Addressing complex real-world, societal challenges with new perspectives, enabling practical & sustainable solutions

-Transformative approaches, & integration & implementation sciences

-Includes multi- & interdisciplinary research

-Includes non-academic stakeholders in knowledge *co-production*

-Orientation to the common good

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






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2. Health, Arts and Performance Initiative (HAPI)





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 Positive impacts of music and all performing, creative & healing arts for societal & individual health, wellbeing, social cohesion & social change







 Within the SA performing & creative arts, wellbeing & health promotion are not considered

Complexity & diversity of conditions & needs in the SA creative sector

RESEARCH ON MUSICIANS' HEALTH AND WELLBEING



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- High rates of musculoskeletal and psychological work-related health issues (and hearing and vocal health issues)
- Nearly 5 decades of research from the global North, including literature on prevalence, risk factors, prevention, health education, systematic reviews, ...
- A small body of recent research from South Africa
- Very limited research utilising African settings, arts practices, perspectives, epistemologies, and conceptual frameworks.

CHALLENGES HERE IN SOUTH AFRICA

- vulnerability and precarity of the performing arts sector
- lack of evidence-based research data on the needs of SA artists
- lack of clear policy frameworks
- lack of awareness
- socioeconomic issues, including health care inequality and inequity
- need for health professionals as key role-players in collaborative research and action







Health, Arts & Performance Initiative (HAPI)

- Health promotion & well-being both IN & THROUGH the performing & creative arts
- Transdisciplinary research: health, medicine, social & behavioural sciences, & arts & humanities; together with the performing & creative arts (music, drama, dance & visual arts)
- Translational applications in practice, education, & research
- African creative arts context: innovation & transformative, reciprocal synergies, social impact, new knowledge



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SU PG RESEARCH TOPICS - examples

- Jazz, pop, and rock drummers' health: developing a drummers' health education course
- Self-determined motivation and musicians' performance efficacy
- Neurodivergent music learners in the school music classroom
- Music students' hearing health behaviours
- Guitarists' performance related musculoskeletal disorders
- Contemporary Commercial Voice pedagogy and practices
- Musculoskeletal disorders in South African musicians of diverse genres
- Music students' perceptions of their employability
- Musculoskeletal symptoms in double bass players
- Community Choirs: societal benefits of community choral activity
- The development of a personal teacher identity
- Embouchure Overuse Syndrome
- Sound formative brass teaching in South Africa
- Music as catalyst for social justice and inclusion of marginalized communities in South Africa







Service-Learning in Music*



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- > Diverse module content taught by specialists from each respective field.
- > Integrate theories of community development with the practice of community work
- > Assist students in the provision of music services to learners with little or no access to music activities
- > Enhance critical awareness of the student's own cultural norms, assumptions, and values
- > Acquaint students with ethical considerations for diverse workplace contexts.
- Provide fundamental musicians' health promotion information
- Introduce students to Music Therapy
- Acquaint students with concept of artistic citizenship: "a skill or collective term for artistic actors, institutions or educational programmes seeking to interact and create dialogue with society"
 (Holgersen & Skov, 2020).



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EXPLORING THE VITAL ROLE OF THE MUSIC LIBRARY



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ENABLERS

Library Service is one university-wide connected entity which supports collaboration across disciplines, departments, and faculties: automatically enabling multi-, inter-, and trans-disciplinarity

Library research support is not specific to separate academic units.

Increasing availability of electronic resources and less dependence on physical resources

Subject-specific music librarians always collaborate with their counterparts in other disciplines to access resources and support teaching, learning, and research **CHALLENGES**



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Budget limitations: practical and systemic restrictions, (e.g., costs of journals, 'niche' resources, etc.)

Despite budget cuts: Need a core collection to support an important innovative transdisciplinary field

Some lack of communication channels between different subject-specific libraries

Lack of university management understanding of the role, skills, knowledge and experience of the subject-specific music librarian

Music libraries housed in independent conservatory settings may not have access to other discipline's libraries **SUGGESTIONS**

EXPLORING THE VITAL ROLE OF THE MUSIC LIBRARY



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Music libraries housed in independent conservatory settings may not have access to other discipline's libraries Identify practical strategies to overcome budget limitations Proactive planning, communication and collaboration between researchers and subject specific librarians to facilitate access to resources

Collaboration between faculty librarians can be initiated by the research project leaders

Identify the specific components of the vitally important role of the MUSIC library in supporting transdisciplinary music-related teaching, learning and research

The music library and music librarians are essential role players in music-related transdisciplinary (TD) teaching, learning, and research.
